



Last year in my message to the 1st Commencement of the Riara University, I drew my inspiration from the memory of my late father, when I was a small boy.

My old father could not read or write; he had never been to school. As a young man however he had seen the first British colonial agents; administrators; farmers and missionaries come to Kenya and each start doing their own thing.

As the young people of my father's generation (*Kienjeku*) observed the activities of the white strangers, it appeared to them that the white strangers had some magic power which enables them to do things which the Africans of the time could not do.

Agonizing over this magic power of the white strangers, my father's generation slowly came to the conclusion that the secret of the power of the white man was hidden in “*githomo*”... education.

To those of my father's generation, “*githomo*” meant one thing only, ...being able to read and write. No wonder many parents sent their sons to the mission schools in rural Kenya to get “*githomo*”.

Today it is obvious that education means more than the ability to read and write. Still the need to acquire education in order to solve the challenges of development is not less today than it was for my father's generation.

Kenya, like any other developing country, must show that we are not only aware of the challenges that we face, but that we are well prepared to solve these challenges, through true empowerment of our people.

I have no doubt in my mind that The Riara University has prepared you well to face, and create solutions for the challenges of today, as well as those of the future. I wish you every success.

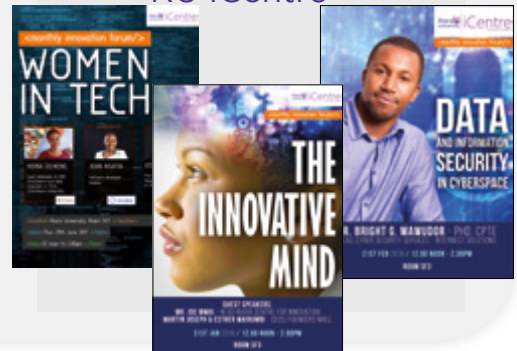
